The Hazeltine Library Story

Just over one hundred years ago Charles Benjamin Reed Hazeltine donated \$5000 to the Town of Busti. He directed the town to use the funds to establish and maintain a library. In addition to the gift from Mr. Hazeltine, money was given by the estate of Fanny Jones.

On December 29, 1922, a charter to establish a new public library was granted. The library opened in 1924, in it's first home—the Busti Town Hall. In 1934, a new library building was built in its present location. In 1975, an addition was made to the building. In 2004, the building was renovated to meet ADA compliance and create more space for patrons and the growing library collection.

Over the past years there have been improvements; including new interior lights, movable book cases, landscape lighting, an awning over the entrance, the addition of a bench and outdoor Lending Library in the front yard and the restoration of the corner sign. The septic system has been upgraded, our parking lot repaved, the bathroom upgraded and we have added an outbuilding to our space.

2019 was the first year the Hazeltine Public Library had 259 funding in place—The district voters approved this line item in the school budget; providing the library with revenue needed to purchase materials, offer programs and operate the library. This stable secure source of funding allows us to plan for the future and meet the needs of our patrons. Our thanks and appreciation goes out to the SWCS district voters.

The Hazeltine Library has over 33,000 books, movies, magazines and audio books on CD

We have high speed internet access and 4 public computers available for free public use

Over 5200 people visit the library each year

E Books have increased in popularity; over 10,000 are downloaded each year by HPL patrons.

Library Trustees have completed a 5 year strategic plan for the library and are working on increasing the collections and the use of technology.

Covid 19 forced the library to close in March 2020 but we are happy to report the library is now open and operating regular hours.

We follow CDC and local health department guidelines—cleaning, sanitizing and working to keep staff and patrons safe. Curbside pickup is available by calling and working with library staff.

Patrons are welcome in the library and we are introducing programming. Community members and library patrons are encouraged to propose programs, suggest local authors and help us move forward.

An outbuilding has been added to our property to increase our capacity, allow for social distancing and provide the community a space for small gatherings—because this is a work in progress; visit or call the library for details.
